



SixtyFeet is an action-based organization created to bring hope and restoration to the imprisoned children of Africa, in Jesus' name. Currently, we serve hundreds of children held in various remand facilities.

What We're Doing

Providing Immediate Relief: Inside the facilities we are meeting immediate needs and providing basic necessities such as food, clean water, medical care, clothing and bedding. We are building deep relationships with the children through love and friendship. In addition, we are working to improve the facilities themselves through power, water, sanitation, gardening and building projects.

Sustainable Rehabilitation: Our team of nurses, counselors, social workers, teachers and pastors is comprised primarily of native Ugandans. By employing locals for this work, we are empowering Ugandans to take the lead in their own recovery, investing in the next generation of leaders. In addition, we have a sponsorship program, which supports a number of children in academic and vocational boarding schools to ensure they are learning skills necessary to function in and contribute to society.

Comprehensive Restoration and Development: We have purchased land and are currently in the process of constructing the first SixtyFeet home. This home, run by native Ugandans, will house the youngest and most vulnerable children that we are given permission to remove. In addition, we've opened a home for teenage girls and a separate home for teenage boys that will house formerly imprisoned children.

Ongoing Counseling and Mentoring: By and large, the children we serve do not have role models, particularly males in whom they can confide. Our team seeks to develop deep relationships with the children and to provide guidance, wisdom, counsel and friendship.

Justice Initiatives: In conjunction with Pepperdine Law School, Regent Law School and others, we advocate on behalf of the children before the courts and the government. The goal of our team is to promote justice by introducing practices that will ensure the children receive a fair and prompt hearing. Our hope is that children spend no longer than necessary in the penal system.
